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## LOGLINE

A modern-day Mr. Rogers with a lot more spunk, Mrs. Sparkles educates and entertains the preschool and kindergarten set with a retro style 30-minute variety show, complete with sing-along music, audience involvement, and life lessons woven in to encourage children to 'sparkle-ize' somebody every day through kindness—and see how it comes back in a great big way!

## SUMMARY

This 30-minute children's educational variety show, taped before a live audience and featuring energetic music, movement, imaginative play and fun-filled thematic lessons, revolves around a central message: when kindness is taught and embraced at an early age, children have the power to change the world. With a Sparkle Gallery audience filled with 25 preschool and kindergarten-aged children and selected Sparkle Rangers who assist Mrs. Sparkles throughout the show, children's involvement is key.

The show introduces foot tapping, sing-along theme songs that current Mrs. Sparkles fans have been singing for years, such as *Sparkle-On!*, *Hello, Everybody* and *The Good-Bye Song*, as well as other timeless songs and original musical pieces. With the help of alternating show elements—such as the Sparkle Chair for story-time, Sparkle-mobile to transport the audience on (previously recorded) field trips, Mr. Grumbles and the Weather Blind to demonstrate attitude and outlook, and a Sparkle-icious Kitchen to highlight healthy eating, among several others—children and their caregivers will find themselves eagerly anticipating the delightful surprises awaiting them in each show's adventure.

A retired Unified Arts kindergarten teacher for 35 years, Mrs. Sparkles' past lesson plans, along with her experiences with young children today, create the foundation for The Mrs. Sparkles Show. Episode themes and show elements are endless. Bullying is just one example of a powerful show concept—after the opening theme songs, the show kicks off as Mrs. Sparkles asks the Sparkle Gallery how it makes them feel when other children aren't nice to them on the playground. The show proceeds to the Sparkle-riffic Puppet Theatre where one puppet character bullies the others to demonstrate the effects of being mean—as well as resolved behaviors. The Imagination Station comes next—Mrs. Sparkles and the Sparkle Rangers gather to create Superhero Anti-Bullying capes with craft supplies listed online to help the television audience prepare and participate. The Mrs. Sparkles Show closes with story-time at the Sparkle Chair featuring a book like "Stop Bullying Bobby!" by Dana Smith-Mansell. As always, each show ends with *The Good-Bye Song* and encouragement for children to go out and sparkle-ize the world.

An expert in early childhood education, Mrs. Sparkles uses her dazzling personality, delightful voice, and considerable insight to engage children through music and fun, teaching valuable lessons that will enrich their lives while bringing a little more sparkle to our world.
